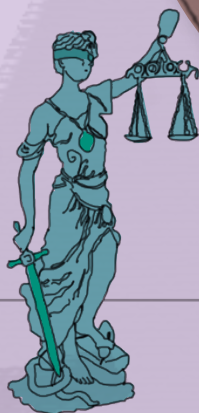

# Introduction

The goal of the event is to make visible the way in which the structures of the Judicial Branch of power reproduce stereotypes and discrimination by gender. This reproduction is reflected in the context of an institutional culture that has tolerated a situation in which women who work in the judicial branch must deal with work discrimination, glass ceilings, harassment, etc. At the same time, it allows jurisdictional work to be carried out with a gender perspective, with judges who issue discriminating sentences that are based on gender stereotypes.
